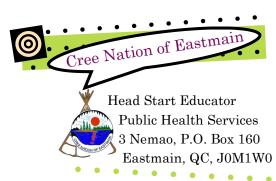


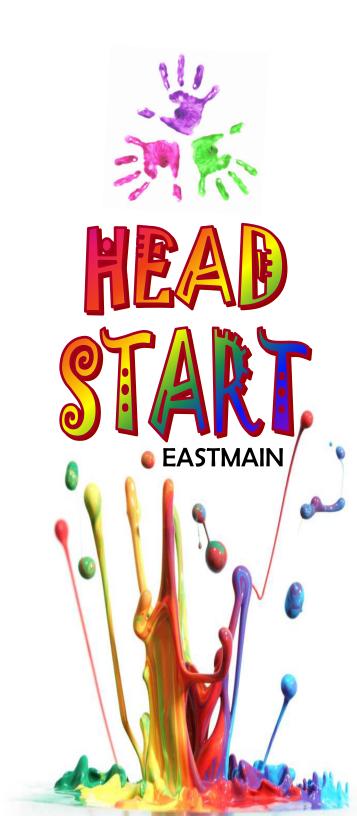

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## HEAD START 2017 - 2018

Each week, your child will have activities in our Public Health Department, centered on the AHSOR (Aboriginal Head Start On Reserve) Program and based on six components:

- 1. Education
- Health Promotion; learning about Healthy Living
- Culture & Language; Cree Literacy , drumming
- 4. Nutrition; healthy cooking, Cree food
- 5. Social Support; injury prevention
- 6. Parental/Family Involvement
